**1 No. dwelling house and installation of package treatment plant and Air Source Heat Pump**


Dear Mr Morrison

We support the sympathetic and imaginative conversion of such buildings, so long as architectural features such as fenestration and doorways and name- and date-stones are retained whenever possible. This appears to be the case with this proposal for Frostrow Chapel.
