Friends of the Dales objects to these applications, which would suburbanise an area near the A683 which is prominent in views from several positions.

Though this may technically be described as a brownfield site, the existing barns are far less intrusive in the open countryside than two dwellings with all their associated domestic features of drives, cars, gardens, washing lines etc which would be well outside the edge of development within Casterton.

Moreover the sites are in close to the major attraction of Devil's Bridge, where traffic at times is fast and heavy, and access to and from the A683 could be dangerous.
